NATIONAL FACIAL PROTECTION AWARENESS

Many sports injuries can be prevented by wearing appropriate protection gear. April is National Facial Protection Month and we want to remind athletes, their parents, and coaches to play it safe by wearing mouth guards and appropriate protective gear when participating in activities that could cause injuries.

The damage caused by a ball, puck or elbow to the face can be devastating for a child or an adult, often resulting in serious injury and a lifetime of oral health issues. In fact, sports-related injuries are the leading cause of emergency room visits in 12- to 17-year-olds according to the Centers for Disease Control. Surprisingly, cheerleading is one of the most dangerous sports, accounting for 65% of all injuries in high school girls' athletics.
